

A new manufacturing plant will be built near Pine Hill and will employ more than 300 people, according to an announcement from Governor Robert Bentley's office. The new, \$100 million Golden Dragon Copper of China plant will bring many needed jobs to the state's Black Belt region. Once the facility is operational, GD Copper (U.S.A.), Inc. expects to employ 300 people. The potential to increase employment numbers to 500 is said to be possible. The company will work with the Alabama Industrial Development Training (AIDT) for work force development.

"I am committed to putting Alabamians back to work, and this is welcome news for a part of the state that has long been in need of new jobs," Governor Bentley said. "The GD Copper (U.S.A.), Inc. project is a prime example of how quickly the industrial marketplace can change," The City of Thomasville partnered with Wilcox County in securing the new site, proving county lines should never be a deterrent in luring projects to a region of Alabama."

George Alford, manager of the Wilcox County Industrial Development Authority, said the project is one of the largest economic development events in the county's history. "Recently, we were named the 15th-poorest county in the United States," Alford said. "We believe this project is the first major step in reducing our high unemployment and poverty rates.", I would like to recognize the efforts of the Alabama-Tombigbee Regional Commission for coordinating the activities of the five (5) local entities involved in our Thomasville-West Wilcox Partnership. I believe one of the main reasons we were able to bring this project to a positive conclusion is the fact that local governments and organizations were able to put aside any differences and work together for one common goal, creating jobs for the citizens of North Clarke and Wilcox counties. Again, let me acknowledge the hard work and cooperation of the Wilcox County Commission, the Town of Pine Hill, the City of Thomasville, the Thomasville Industrial Development Board, the Wilcox County Industrial Development Authority, the Alabama Development Office, the Alabama Department of Transportation, Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs, and the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers.

"We are very encouraged to have this company coming to Wilcox County," Pine Hill Mayor Harry Mason said. "It is an exciting economic development opportunity for the area."

The Alabama Development Office is a sponsor of the Alabama China Partnership's Spring Symposium on March 15 and 16 in Monroeville. Several Chinese government, business, and media officials are expected to attend the event, including representatives of up to 50 businesses from China.
